 An Overview of 2015 Licensure Renewal Data



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INTRODUCTION

- The Ohio Board of Nursing is charged with licensing nurses. Licensure renewal
 is completed on odd numbered years for RNs and APRNs, and even
 numbered years for LPNs.
- This report provides an analysis of the licensure renewal data for 2015. Starting in 2013, the questions asked of licensees who completed on-line renewal are based on the nursing Minimum Data Set (Colleagues in Caring Project), core data questions developed by the HRSA National Center for Health Workforce Analysis, and the joint 2013 survey conducted by the National Forum of State Nursing Workforce Centers and the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN). This provides a comprehensive picture of the aggregate RN and APRN workforce in Ohio.

- The number of APRNs grew more rapidly (24.6%) than RNs (3.4%)



- The distribution of RNs among the five regions in Ohio has remained fairly stable from 2013 to 2015.
- All regions saw an increase in the number of RNs, with the exception of NW Ohio which saw a 3.8% decrease related to nurses living in Ohio and working in a neighboring state.
- The proportion of APRNs grew substantially in all regions.









Second Language Proficiency All Online Renewals





DEMOGRAPHICS: ARMED SERVICES


Armed Services, 2015 Only

Board Service, 2015 Only







 Highest nursing degree obtained does not vary tremendously by gender, race, or years of experience. However, in SE Ohio a significantly higher proportion (51.5% in 2015) of nurses cited Associate Degree RN as their highest nursing degree than those in other Ohio regions.







Those Working As a Nurse: Work Location




EMPLOYMENT: YEARS OF EXPERIENCE












EMPLOYMENT: NUMBER OF WEEKS WORKED IN PAST YEAR




