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## INTRODUCTION

- The Ohio Board of Nursing is charged with licensing nurses. Licensure renewal is completed on odd numbered years for RNs and APRNs, and even numbered years for LPNs.
- This report provides an analysis of the licensure renewal data for 2015. Starting in 2013, the questions asked of licensees who completed on-line renewal are based on the nursing Minimum Data Set (Colleagues in Caring Project), core data questions developed by the HRSA National Center for Health Workforce Analysis, and the joint 2013 survey conducted by the National Forum of State Nursing Workforce Centers and the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN). This provides a comprehensive picture of the aggregate RN and APRN workforce in Ohio.

- The number of licensees grew by $4.7 \%$ from 2013 to 2015.
- The number of APRNs grew more rapidly (24.6\%) than RNs (3.4\%)

- The distribution of RNs among the five regions in Ohio has remained fairly stable from 2013 to 2015.
- All regions saw an increase in the number of RNs , with the exception of NW Ohio which saw a $3.8 \%$ decrease related to nurses living in Ohio and working in a neighboring state.
- The proportion of APRNs grew substantially in all regions.

- About $85 \%$ of nurses who renewed in 2015 were working as a nurse; this is down slightly (about 1.5\% points) from 2013.
*Note that due to a large proportion of licensees who did not renew online in 2013, this number was likely lower than the actual number.

- The proportion of RNs with a baccalaureate degree as their initial nursing degree is increasing slowly. More than half of RNs under age 30 have obtained their BSN.

- Highest nursing degree obtained does not vary tremendously by gender, race, or years of experience. However, in SE Ohio a significantly higher proportion ( $51.5 \%$ in 2015) of nurses cited Associate Degree RN as their highest nursing degree than those in other Ohio regions.

## EMPLOYMENT: CURRENT JOB STATUS



- Most registered nurses are working as nurses, especially APRNs (94.4\% in 2015).
- Very few of RNs (3.1\%) were unemployed and seeking work as a nurse.

## EMPLOYMENT: YEARS OF EXPERIENCE



- In 2015 the proportion of nurses with five or fewer years of experience decreased (from $21 \%$ to $16.7 \%$ ). This is likely a function of the recent increased proportion of nursing students continuing on to obtain their BSN as their first nursing degree.
